Becoming an Invitational Parish

- > Pray.

- > Stay behind for a cup of coffee after Mass and talk to someone you have never spoken to before.
- Get involved in serving the after Mass hospitality.
- Assist with welcoming people as they come to Mass and handing out the Sunday bulletin.
- > Smile at someone even though they have unwittingly taken your usual seat.
- Ask someone who may be new to the parish or is a visitor if they need any assistance.
- ➤ If you belong to a small group or parish apostolate invite new people to join.
- > Be gracious to a family who may have exuberant or restless children.
- Always be welcoming of anyone who is returning to the practise of the faith and encourage them to continue in their journey as a fellow disciple.
- > Encourage fellow parishioners to be invitational.
- Ask others what we need to do to be more invitational.

What is the point?

To share the joy of the Gospel and to be an active and vibrant disciple of the Lord as we rejoice in our Catholic faith and traditions. To live as Christ.
