## 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

### 10th February 2019



I can hear myself in Peter's resigned words to Jesus: "We have worked all night long but have caught nothing ...."

So much of the spiritual life is about devoted repetition of the same actions, which sometimes seem to have no effect. I pray the same words day after day and year after year, and I do not see any change. I speak kindly and seem to be ignored. ....

On a fishing boat with seasoned fishermen, Jesus' advice is almost laughable. *As if they had not thought to put down the nets.* What God whispers into our souls is often not the shocking instruction to build an ark, but the ordinary invitation to try love again. Walk beside our people and laugh with them. Respond to those who ask you for help – again. Make something for dinner and share a meal.

And then, when all that habitual love produces something unexpectedly beautiful, do I respond like Peter? Forgive me for my doubt that loving again will actually change the world. Let me choose faith in love – again.

**World Marriage Day-10th February 2019**

Today we honour husbands and wives on the occasion of the international observance of World Marriage Day. World Marriage Day honours husband and wife as the foundation of the family, the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice and joy in daily married life. Sponsored by the Worldwide Marriage Encounter, World Marriage Day is held annually every second Sunday of February. In 1993, his Holiness, Pope John Paul II, imparted his Apostolic Blessings on *World Marriage Day* and since then *World Marriage Day* celebrations continue to grow and spread to more countries and faith expressions every year. The first World Marriage Day celebration in New Zealand was held in Wellington in 2017.



*Marriage is the icon of God's love for us. Indeed, God is also communion: the three Persons of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit live eternally in perfect unity. And this is precisely the mystery of marriage: God makes of the two spouses one single existence. This has concrete daily consequences, because the spouses, 'in virtue of the sacrament, are invested with a true and proper mission, so that, starting with the simple ordinary things of life they can make visible the love with which Christ loves his Church and continues to give his life for her'.*

Welcome to 2019. Firstly, thanks to those who participated in Parish events during Advent, Christmas and New Year and for your awesome generosity. We look forward to you continuing to participate in our Parish family in 2019 and beyond. I have a new word - "**participate**" be involved; take part, to engage, join, get involved, share, play a part, play a role, cooperate, help, assist, lend a hand. I like **the word "participate"** as it means that we are all involved, and the word means we are never passive. What is the truer statement 'I went to Mass' or 'I participated at Mass'? Participate means involvement and that is the essence of all liturgy and our Catholic Faith. We ought never be passive, and our language needs to reflect in telling people that our sacraments are moments of participating. In liturgy, we are called to participate. Participation requires our investment in the liturgy. It requires our openness to God acting through words, gestures, music, prayers, and material objects. Participation is not about showing up or doing things; rather, participation may lead to transformation. Although participation requires showing up and doing things, another level allows what happens to shape us. Our participation in liturgy may allow us to grow in our knowledge of and union with God, who seeks and desires our growth in holiness. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy says we are called to "full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations." The more you put in the more you get out.
