Reflection for Today

I became a Catholic 45 years ago for many reasons. Top of the list was the Church's teaching on the Eucharist. It was a beautiful journey ... from knowing nothing to revelation and love. The joy is that the journey is never over. Every Mass is a new encounter with what it means to believe in the Real Presence.

Father Anthony wrote the reflection for Corpus Christi last year. I lean on his learning to reiterate the two key points he made. First, the Eucharist is a sacred mystery, beyond the proofs of science. *"We are tempted to belittle the mysterious and miraculous aspects of our Christian faith. The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is the Church's reminder that God is bigger than our limited human minds."* Difficulties and 'unbelief' should act as springboards for the working – the superior working – of faith.

Secondly, for Catholics, Holy Communion is a sacrament, not merely a symbol. Let's be frank. The simple forms of bread and wine have little to offer; that's not what draws us to our churches. It is the prayer of consecration when bread and wine take on another reality and become Christ Himself. The catechism is clear: *"In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist the whole Christ is truly, really and substantially contained."* (CCC1374) And Jesus is clear: *"Whoever eats me will draw life from me...and live forever."* Can any symbol do that?



So, KEEP MASS IN YOUR LIFE. Bring your difficulties, your unbelief, your whatever – and come. By the mysterious channels of grace Christ will fill you with his glorified life. Then what? Then it's time to have a heart-to-heart talk about many things for *"He will surely give us what we ask of Him since He is in our house.* (St Teresa of Avila)
