Reflection for Today

Chapter 15 of Luke's Gospel has been called, "The Gospel within the Gospel." It is the essence of the Good News about the mercy of our forgiving, Heavenly Father. This is similar to the title of a book that Cardinal Walter Kasper wrote. "Mercy: The Essence of the Gospel and the Key to Christian Life". All of chapter 15, "The Parable of the Lost and Found," is essentially a single parable with three illustrations. The story of the lost sheep, the story of the lost coin, and the major story of the lost son. These stories remind us that we have a God who welcomes sinners and forgives their sins whenever they return to Him with genuine contrition and resolution. As for all relationships, it needs initiative from both sides. God is always searching for us, calling us back to His love and mercy. How is our response to that call?

The problem with the scribes and Pharisees is that they were self-righteous. They, arrogantly, thought and believed that they were without sin – and always in God's graces. But there is no person who is completely righteous. We are all sinners, no matter who we are. There is always more we have failed to do. We all know, we do not always get things right. There are times we make mistakes. There are times we make the wrong choices. We sometimes say to ourselves "I wish I did not do or say that." These are the moments of loss in our lives. We regret these actions. The gospel today gives us hope. We must remember that in the third parable, the father was always there waiting for his son to return. The Lord is also waiting for us to return to him. Particularly in the sacrament of reconciliation. No matter who we are, or how we have sinned, God still loves us and wants to bring us to Himself. Therefore, throughout this week, we can ask ourselves.

"How often do I participate in the sacrament of reconciliation?"

Māori Language Week

Parishioners are invited to attend Miha i Te Reo Māori *Mass in the Māori Language* to celebrate Māori Language Week on Sunday 18th September 08:00am at Pakipaki. Miha will be celebrated by Pā Chris Martin SM, assisted by Deacon Danny Karatea-Goddard from the Home of Compassion Island Bay who will also give the homily.

Mass in the Māori Language is a unique part of our Catholic faith in Aotearoa New Zealand. On arrival to our country, Bishop Pompallier decreed that there should be Māori Catechists to maintain the Māori Missions as priests did their best to visit their communities over large areas. One role of the Katekita *Catechist* was to recite the Mass to the congregation in Te Reo Māorim, while the priest celebrated the Mass in Latin. This was so that the people knew what was happening in the Mass, and what the priest was saying. Today some of these traditions of the Katekita have continued into Vatican II liturgies.
