# Reflection for Today

As a catholic, we do not **only** believe in the *scripture*, but also in the *tradition*, which is the teaching of the Church. We profess about it at Sunday Mass. "I believe in one Holy Catholic and Apostolic church". However, we sometimes ignore the teaching of the Church. It is not an easy thing to talk about in recent years. In the gospel this week, Jesus said: "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfil". It would surprise all the people who heard this. This is because Jesus was constantly accused of breaking the law, and finally, the accusation at his death was that he was breaking the laws continuously. As we heard in the weekday gospel, people observed that He did not wash his hands prior to the meal, as the law demanded. He healed people on the Sabbath day, and now He speaks of the law with veneration and reverence that no Scribe or Rabbi could exceed.

Jesus tells them that not even the smallest part of the law will be changed, and He is there to fulfil the law and bring it to completion. Indeed, Jesus came to fulfil the law by His own example, sacrificing His life for the Salvation of souls. We need to remember that when we show our obedience to the law of The Lord and The Church, we must be prompted by our love of God and gratitude to God for His blessings. To keep God's commandments, we must trust in Him and in His plan for us. And that trust involves the surrender of our ego to God's will and to His immense wisdom. So, maybe this week, we must reflect on our attitude towards the Law of the Lord through the Church.

Such as: "Do we really keep the Sunday Obligation as a part of our belief?"

### World Marriage Day - 12th February 2023

Today we honour husbands and wives on the occasion of the international observance of World Marriage Day. World Marriage Day honours husband and wife as the foundation of the family, the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice and joy in daily married life.

Sponsored by the Worldwide Marriage Encounter, World Marriage Day is held annually every second Sunday of February. In 1993, his Holiness, Pope John Paul II, imparted his Apostolic Blessings on *World Marriage Day* and since then *World Marriage Day* celebrations continue to grow and spread to more countries and faith expressions every year. The first World Marriage Day celebration in New Zealand was held in Wellington in 2017.

Marriage is the icon of God's love for us. Indeed, God is also communion: the three Persons of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit live eternally in perfect unity. And this is precisely the mystery of marriage: God makes of the two spouses one single existence. This has concrete daily consequences, because the spouses, 'in virtue of the sacrament, are invested with a true and proper mission, so that, starting with the simple ordinary things of life they can make visible the love with which Christ loves his Church and continues to give his life for her'.
