# Reflection for Today

Today we reflect on the mystery of our faith which is the mystery of the Holy Trinity. As human beings, we cannot fully understand this. However, through the gospel today we know that if we believe in Jesus as our Lord then everything about the Holy Trinity would be a part of our faith. Our reading for today is a continuation of our gospel reading for last week. We are at the Last Supper, just after Judas has left and Jesus has told the remaining eleven that He must soon depart too. Jesus then said to his disciples: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always". One of the greatest gifts that God had given us is the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit continue speaks to us, guiding us in all the days of our lives. The question is do we listen to His voice?

The words that Jesus said in the gospel today is quite comforting to us who believe in Him. "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live, and you will live." We live by faith; the faith gives us a certain vision of the things of God. By believing in Jesus, we can see Him or experience His present in our lives with the eyes of faith. It is like when we love someone. We cannot always see them face to face; however, we still feel the love that they have for us. Today, as we celebrate "Mother's Day" we remember the sacrifices made by mothers for their children. Sometimes we cannot

explain with words or see with our physical eyes their love, but we know and feel that the love of a mother is always there for her children. Let us ask the Most Blessed Virgin Mary to prepare our heart to be worthy to receive the Body of her Son in the sacrament of the Eucharist. We then become Mary's child in the Son, by the coming of the Holy Spirit, it will then be the moment for us to cry out: "Abba! Father!" (Rm. 8:15)

Cardinal John remains as Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Palmerston North and continues with his various Vatican roles, including membership of the College of Cardinals, able to take part in papal elections until aged 80.
