Reflection for Today

As we celebrate the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time, it's important to reflect on the abundance of the Kingdom of God. This week's readings teach us about the significance of personal commitment, willingness, and true engagement with faith. By trusting in God's care and guidance, we can find fulfilment and happiness in all of life's circumstances.

In the Gospel, Jesus shares the parable of a king who throws a wedding feast for his son. This wedding feast represents the fullness of salvation, with the bridegroom symbolizing the Son of God himself, Jesus Christ. The parable emphasizes the importance of accepting God's invitation to his kingdom and responding accordingly. Although we are all invited to participate in the wedding feast of God's love, not everyone will accept. Some will reject the invitation altogether, while others will come unprepared, like the one who did not wear a wedding garment.

The wedding garment represents our lives, or at least our lives since accepting the invitation of God's grace. The clothes and our lives are washed white at baptism but must be kept clean by how we live and through the sacraments, particularly reconciliation and the Eucharist. While God offers salvation to all, it doesn't mean that everyone will be saved, as many will reject the invitation. Even those of us who receive the invitation must live in a way worthy of the feast. Let's reflect on how we can clothe ourselves more fully in righteousness and live in a way that is worthy of

Caritas calls for peace and prayer amidst renewed violence in Holy Land.

Brother Peter Bray FSC of Bethlehem University on Israel-Hamas war

Brother Peter Bray FSC from New Zealand is the vice chancellor of Bethlehem University on the Occupied West Bank. He has given the NZ Catholic Bishops his first-hand candid view on what is happening in the region now as fighting continues between Hamas and Israel.

"This is a watershed moment that could have long-term impact on life here in the Holy Land," he says. "I was not surprised by the attack on Israel by Hamas. While I do not approve of violence as a response, given the ongoing and increasingly violent attacks on Palestinians by the Israeli military and the settlers over recent months, as well as the provocative moves by settlers around AI-Aqsa Mosque in Jerusalem during the Jewish feast, I can understand why the Palestinians reacted in the way they did."
