FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT 17th March 2024

Reflection for Today

The raising of Lazarus is a revival or return to his own life. Therefore, it is not the same as the resurrection of Jesus. Lazarus eventually died, as we all will, and relies on the risen Lord for his participation in eternal life, when all things will be restored. This sign, like all of those in John's gospel, points to the truth about Jesus: "But these (the signs) are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name." (Jn 20: 31) The purpose of us listening to the Word is not recreation, amusement or academic interest, it is a living Word that calls forth a response of belief in Jesus Christ just as Jesus' conversation with Martha asks for faith in him. Let our response, together with the catechumens and candidates preparing to come into the Catholic Church be: "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world." (Jn 11: 27)

FEAST OF ST JOSEPH - 19th March

Who was Joseph historically? He was the son of Jacob of the House of David, husband of Mary of Nazareth and foster father of Jesus. He was a skilled carpenter and a righteous man who honoured the Law. Although the Scriptures do not record anything he ever said, there are several accounts of what he did to safeguard the infant Christ and to provide for Him and for the Virgin Mother. Jesus first understood God as a loving Father through Joseph.



Pope Francis writes this of him: "I have a great love for St Joseph, because he is a man of silence and strength. When I have a difficulty I write a little note and put it under an image of St Joseph. I tell him, "Pray for this problem." There is nothing we can ask him that he's not willing to answer. **Go to Joseph for everything** because he knows about every sphere of family life. We can also turn to him as the patron saint of a happy death.

Hopefully all parishioners are alert to the impending conclusion of the 2023 financial year and that donations to the parish can receive a 33% rebate from the government. The parish is grateful for all your hard work, ministries and generous contributions that make CPH such a vibrant parish. Nevertheless, I would like to remind everyone of the following:

- **1.** Being on automatic payment and/or donating by planned giving envelopes is the best way to generate a receipt for tax purposes.
- **2.** One off payment to the parish can receive a receipt and will be treated as planned to give which includes 27% that goes towards the Clergy Trust Fund.
- **3**. Specified donations, for example, for the Hastings Catholic Youth, also obtain receipts but do not provide the 27%.
- **4.** Cash is still welcome, and the collection basket is handed around to express our solidarity as we support the parish which is owned by us all
- **5.** It is an option to re-donate your tax rebate back to the parish this is much appreciated.
- **6.** Inflation, as we can see everywhere, eats into the value of your donations. Please consider a small increase to your automatic payment and/or envelope giving.
- 7. Please do not forget about the special appeals which turn up from time to time, such as the collection for the Holy Places on Good Friday.
- **8.** The Easter and Christmas collections go to the Clergy trust Fund which sustains the clergy of the diocese. If you wish to make a gift to an individual priest or deacon, you will need to do this in person.
- **9**. Mass intentions, which bind a donor to the Mass in a special way by having it offered for his or her specific intentions, can be for the living or the dead. A financial offering is not essential; however, it is customary. The sum of \$10 for a Mass intention is considered suitable.
- **10.** Please consider putting CPH in your will for a part of your estate. This, again, would be much appreciated.
