Reflection for Today

The sign that God revealed to us on this 4th Sunday of Advent is highly significant. God's choice of the Messiah was from the house of David, however, Mary's child belongs to all **nations**, so we all form part of the nation. This is through **God's love**, and God's **invitation** to share in Christ's heritage. Therefore, Christ is coming for the sake of all of us. In the **first reading**, God gave us the greatest and most definitive signs about the Messiah. It is important to note that this sign was given to King Ahaz only after he **humbled** himself by refusing to put God to test.

Both the **second reading** and the **gospel** of today are the story about the birth and life of Christ. They remind us the signs that God gave to us, through the prophets, (that is, the signs which are the foundation of our hope this season), are not *empty words*, rather they are true and fulfilled in Christ.

The lessons here include that, **firstly**, we must **allow** God to be God without trying to assume/ take over him. Secondly, we must learn to trust in God's judgment and His good will for us. Thirdly, we need not run after signs anymore because God has given us the fullness of revelation in Jesus Christ. The fourth, if we humble ourselves God will reveal to us, "the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ" (Eph 1, 9).




