The Gospel today tells us about the visit of the Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. This visit took place a short time after the "Incarnation of the Word of God" in Mary. It was the Angel Gabriel who invited Mary to visit her cousin, who was six months pregnant at the time. The Angel told Mary about the pregnancy of her cousin Elizabeth.

The beginning of the Gospel today tells us that "Mary set out and travelled to the hill country in haste" (Lk 1: 39). Mary was fully aware of the task given to her by God and prepared for her mission. As the Mother of God, the mission was to bring into the world a child who is God in person. Mary was in a hurry to see her cousin, bringing Jesus to them. The Gospel told us that Elizabeth recognised something great as soon as Mary entered the house of Zechariah and greeted her. Though both women are with child in their womb, it is Mary who takes the initiative to visit Elizabeth. In a sense, this is right and proper because Mary is the younger of the two. On the other hand, we know that the status of Mary is higher because she bears within her the Son of God. This is an act of humility that we can learn from our Lady as well as our Lord. We all know that Jesus said in the gospel "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve" (Mathew 20: 28). Through this gospel we can say that Jesus did it even before He is born. It is through serving that the world recognise Jesus as Lord. Just like Mary, we have received Christ through the Eucharist, therefore we have been asked to bring Him to the world, to our societies and our families.

The bishops believe dioceses and parishes will be welcoming the Vatican's four-month extension for the local phase of the Synod process. The deadline of the first (local) phase of the two-year international



synodal process has been extended from next April to next 15 August. NZCBC Secretary Bishop Steve Lowe says the original timeframe was difficult for Southern Hemisphere countries because of our summer holiday period, with the Covid-19 restrictions making face-to-face contact hard.
