Reflection for Today

Body and Blood of Christ - food for the journey

All of us are on a journey home to the Father. Jesus has given us real food and real drink to sustain us on the way. This is his Body and his Blood. Whenever we gather, we remember the night before he died. He took bread, blessed it and said do this in remembrance of me. Jesus did the same with the cup. This food and drink satisfy our ancient hungers. Whoever eats my Body and drinks my Blood will have eternal life in them.

The Church makes the Eucharist, and the Eucharist makes the Church. In the person of Christ our priest says the prayer over the bread and over the wine. He has been ordained a priest for this special occasion. It is a real privilege for him to lead God's people in the prayer of Eucharist. We give thanks to God for our priests. Those who have been newly ordained and those who have faithfully served for fifty years or more.

It is the Eucharist that nourishes and strengthens the members of the Church. They reach out and take the Body of Christ. They return to their place in the Community with Jesus present within. It is a time of real union. A time to give thanks. Having received they are now ready to go forth to share the person of Jesus with others.

Before our Lord Jesus Christ passed from this world to return to the Father, he left the sacrament of his Body and Blood. When the hour comes for us to pass from this life and join him, he strengthens us with this food for our journey and comforts us by this pledge of our resurrection.

Jesus Christ is the food for our journey; he calls us to the heavenly table.

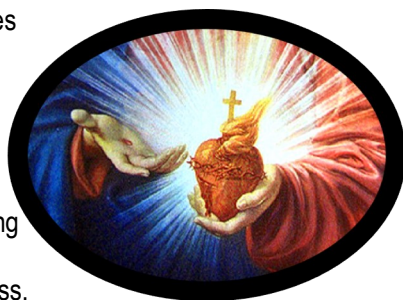

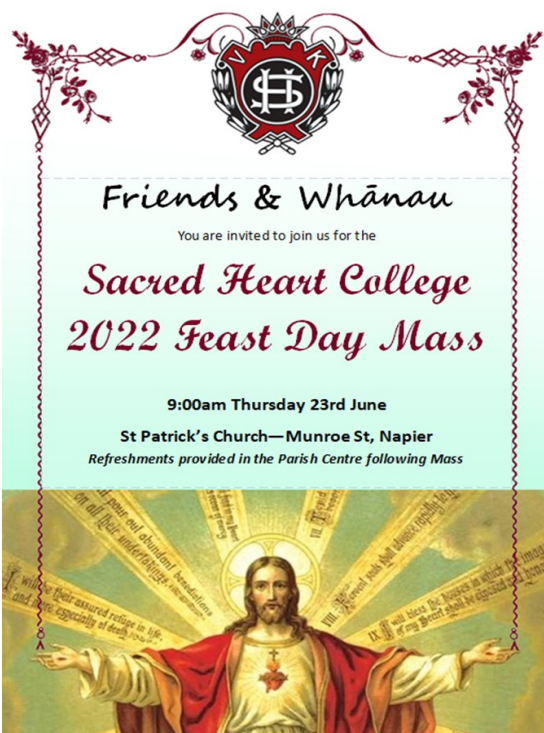
Final opportunity to give to the Bishops' Lent 2022 appeal
