# Reflection for Today

In the gospel of Mark, we heard about the first time Jesus made the three predictions, His suffering, death, and resurrection. Today's reading is the second time. Between the two predictions Jesus gave Peter, James and John, a glimpse of the glory that was to be His after the resurrection, the scene of the Transfiguration. This would give the apostles the encouragement to face what is to come in the life of Jesus. However, His arrest, passion, and death on the cross came as a shattering blow for them. Destroying their concept of Messiah. As the gospel recites, "they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him". Through His life, Jesus proves that He is the Christ, the one whom God chose to bring to the world the life-giving Spirit. The Spirit who is Lord and who gives Life, as we say in the Creed.

The second part of the gospel today gives us more details of how to show our faith to people around us. The apostles still did not understand about the servant leader, which Jesus wanted to teach them. Therefore, they were highly embarrassed and very reluctant to disclose to him what they had been arguing about. At the centre of their concern was who amongst them was the greatest. Jesus knew what was going on in the apostles' minds. He set a child before them. He sat down and said to them: "If anyone wants to be first, they must make themselves last of all and servant of all". He took a helpless, powerless child, with no status whatsoever, and told them that this is the way we all must be. We must be humble especially in our minds and hearts, if we would like to become what God wants us to be. Moreover, it is in our childlike simplicity that Jesus and the Father will come to us. The call to each one of us is that we need to try to treat everyone with love and respect because, "Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life" (St. Basil), CCC # 336.
