

Reflection for Today

Christians work for "A Life" not just for "A Living"

The Lord left behind a pledge of this hope and strength for life's journey in that sacrament of faith where natural elements refined by man are gloriously changed into His Body and Blood, providing a meal of brotherly solidarity and a foretaste of the heavenly banquet. (Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, Gaudium et Spes, no. 38) Last week Jesus performed the multiplication of the loaves, and all the people who witnessed the amazing miracle wanted to make him a king. He is surrounded by this huge, adoring crowd of people willing to follow him to the death if only he will agree to be their king, to bring them political freedom and prosperity. But Jesus didn't come to earth to spark a political revolution. He had a much bigger agenda, and so do his followers. He tries to explain this to them. He says: "Do not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life." (John 6:27)
