## Reflection for Today

Today is the last Sunday of the church's calendar. It's called 'Christ the King Sunday'.

This is a great reminder to us that we belong to a kingdom where God is our King. We should try our best to be with Him at the end of our lives and this should be the goal of all Christians. The gospel reading today takes us back to the scene of Calvary. Jesus is abandoned by his disciples. Not many people who were journeying with Him in the last three years remained faithful to Him except Mary, John, Mary Magdalene, and perhaps a few others. He is the Suffering Servant who takes upon Himself all our sinfulness and redeems us as our Saviour, therefore, Jesus Christ must always be the centre of our lives and hearts. He is the leader we must follow – But He is also our 'Brother' who walks with us on our journey of life. Jesus is the one sent by the Father so that our radical brokenness can be healed. However, there are times when we are too proud of ourselves. We do not want to surrender our lives to Jesus, letting Him be the healer of our souls. There are many things in society that influence the way we think about ourselves. Sometimes we live based on what people tell us about who we are. The reading today, as well as the way Jesus lived His earthly life, helps us to look a bit deeper into our own lives. People were condemning Jesus, mocking, ridiculing, and reviling Him. He is still the King. We need to remember that, on the date of our baptism, we became citizens of the Kingdom of God, becoming God's children. This is the essence of our faith; however, this also requires us to take responsibility for it. We need to ask ourselves "What can we do to contribute to God's kingdom?" The Solemnity of Christ the King reminds us that Jesus is the central mystery of our faith, inviting us to put our trust in our King who will look after us as His citizens and as His children.


