Reflection for Today

"Repent, and believe the Good News".

There is an urgency in the Scriptures today. When Jonah is sent by God to preach to the Ninevites they have a time frame of forty days. St Paul tells the Corinthians that "time is growing short" and Jesus opens his ministry in Galilee with the words, "The time has come." What is behind this push to be quick and decisive? It is the need for repentance, to start over in our relationship with God. This is not a matter for constantly putting off for later. It is for now. Once we recognise the need to change our path in life we must act immediately. Like Simon and Andrew, James and John we leave whatever our nets are, even family ties, and go after the Lord.

Repentance can be quite radical. It means admitting that all is not well with ourselves, with our values and goals in life. And that's not easy. Part of the problem is that repentance is often presented as a negative thing – feeling guilty about sins and doing penance for them. In a word, *"sackcloth"*! But repentance can be a very positive thing. It is an opportunity to shed an old 'skin' and discover a better self. An honest look at our lives can bring us to take a new direction. Today, ask yourself, *'Am I in the best place right now? If not, what changes should I make?'* The Good News is good when it is liberating and because it always leads to fullness of life and to God.

Dear Parishioners of the Catholic Parish of Hastings



Word of God Sunday is an annual commemoration in the Catholic Church. On the third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Catholics throughout the world join together in re-committing and deepening their engagement with the Sacred Scriptures. The theme this year is from John 8:31 *"Remain in My Word."* Salvation, faith, unity and mercy all depend on knowing Christ and Sacred Scripture. Below are ways we can do this.

Ars Celebrandi (The art of celebration)

'Every gesture and every word contains a precise action that is always new because it meets with an always new moment in our own lives... for the celebration of the Word... Ah, what are we summoned to learn for the proclamation of the Word, for the hearing of it, for letting it inspire our prayers, for making it become our very life?' #53

What can we do?

Below are some suggestions for this Sunday with reference to Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter Motu Proprio *Aperuit illis* (2019). **Focus attention in the liturgy.** "It is important that in the Eucharistic celebration the sacred text be enthroned, in order to focus the attention of the assembly on the normative value of God's word." **Pray for Proclaimers of the Word**. Take the opportunity on Word of

God Sunday to pray for those who are entrusted with reading the Scriptures at Mass.

Commit time to reflect on the Word. Read the scriptures of the following Sunday as a companion for daily reflection and ministry. Share with others your own reflections for the following Sunday's readings. **Lectio Divina. Listen to the scripture readings each day.**
