Reflection for Today

Lent: A Time to Walk in the Way of Light

Today, in the last part of Lent, the Church proposes this Gospel to help us attain Palm Sunday, ready to live up to these mysteries, so outstanding for our Christian life. The Via Crucis, or the Way of the Cross, becomes for us Christians a "Via Lucis", or the Way of Light, because dying is to be born again or, even better, we must die so that we can live the Truth in the Light.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the Apostles: "Unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it produces much fruit" (Jn 12:24). In this respect, St. Augustine comments: "Jesus said He was "grain", that was to be mortified, to multiply afterwards; He was to be mortified by the infidelity of the Jews and He was to multiply for the faith of all the people."

The Gospel ends with an exhortation to walk in the light of the Son lifted from the earth: "And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all to myself." (Jn 12:32). Let God's light shine always through us to help us dispelling all darkness. It is God's moment now, let us not lose it! "Are you sleeping? The time granted to you goes by fast!" (St. Ambrose of Milan). We must not stop being a light to the world. As the moon gets its light from the sun, we are to be seen reflecting God's light in us so that our way of life will truly be Walking in the Way of Light.

PALM SUNDAY UPDATE

Next Sunday, 28 March, is Palm Sunday. The procession with palms will take place at the following Masses:

St Peter Chanel 5.30pm Vigil Mass and 10.30am Sunday - parishioners are requested to gather on the grassed area in front of the church.

8am Immaculate Conception, Pakipaki - parishioners will gather in front of the marae at 7.55am.

9am Sacred Heart - parishioners will gather in the school grounds to the right of the church

9.30am Our Lady of Lourdes - parishioners will gather outside of the main entrance.

There will be no procession at the 5.30pm Mass at Sacred Heart where there will be a simple blessing of the palms at the start of Mass with the Gospel.

Parishioners are warmly encouraged to arrive in good time for the Mass so as not to delay the start of the liturgy.

Chrism Mass 2021



The Chrism Mass will be celebrated for the Palmerston North Diocese, by Cardinal John Dew, at noon on Monday 29 March. This is a different time than usual however it does give an opportunity to those who are not

constrained by paid work commitments to participate in this beautiful ceremony. I encourage anyone who has not yet attended a Chrism Mass join with the others from around the diocese on that day.

Liturgical Celebrations

We are heading towards the highlight of the Church's liturgical year. The celebrations which mark these days are central to our identity as Catholics. I encourage all parishioners to make attending church a priority at this time. It is through enacting these mysteries that we can know and understand our vocation as the baptised and the glorious patrimony of faith and tradition that has been handed on to us. We have:

Palm Sunday - enacting the triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem. This prophetic action announced the fulfilment of the Old Testament prophecies regarding the Messiah who would save the people from their sins. It also helps us to understand why the Jewish authorities felt they needed to kill him.

Chrism Mass (noon at the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit in Palmerston North) - Cardinal John will bless the holy oils we will use at the Easter Vigil and for the rest of the year. As a diocesan event it witnesses to our unity and mission to bring the Good News to the people of this region.

Holy Thursday (7pm at Sacred Heart) - The washing of feet speaks of Jesus enacting the leadership through service that he desired to be imitated by his disciples. With the institution of the Holy Eucharist we also affirm all those who have ministry to distribute Holy Communion or to take it to the sick.

Good Friday Cross Walk - There will be the usual ecumenical cross walk in Hastings city. An addition this year will be a walk organised by the Youth Ministry starting at 9am at Our Lady of Lourdes and proceeding to Saint Peter Chanel and Sacred Heart, concluding with the 3pm service.

Good Friday (3pm at all churches) - The Passion of our Lord is enacted with the reading of the Passion according to the Gospel of John. We experience something of the desolation and loss the disciples endured on that day and venerate the cross thus acknowledging the saving power of Christ's sacrifice in our own lives.

Easter Vigil (8.15pm at Sacred Heart) - The whole mystery of Creation and salvation is celebrated as we bless the Easter fire and rejoice in the victory of Christ over darkness, sin and death so as to make it our own.

Easter Sunday (usual Mass times) - Please note that there is no 5.30pm Sunday evening Mass at Sacred Heart) - The rejoicing in the resurrection continues as it does for the whole of Eastertide. The celebration of baptisms speaks of the new life given us through the resurrection such that we are adopted as brothers and sisters of the Risen Christ.

Please continue to pray for the Alpha course leaders and participants. Also, for the Sacramental programme an ongoing prayers request for the course leaders and participants.
