Reflection for Today

Humility and Repentance in Prayer

Readings: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18; Psalms 34:2-3, 17-18, 19, 23; Second Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18; Luke 18:9-14

The Book of Sirach beautifully and promisingly says, "The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds." Such prayers are heard because they come from the hearts of people who know how much they need God. Again, Jesus reminds us that God hears the prayers of the one who approaches Him in humility with a repentant heart. God did not hear the prayer of this Pharisee because he exalted himself. His prayer was a prayer of thanksgiving that he was not as evil as other people. He announced to God his freedom from sin and detailed his fidelity in observing the prescribed fast and in giving tithes. The tax collector's prayer, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner," was heard because he humbled himself, acknowledging his sins and requesting God's mercy.

Jesus challenges us to imitate the humble publican (tax collector). It is because his prayer makes a connection with God. First, it acknowledges God's greatest quality in relation to fallen humanity, his mercy. The word "mercy" comes from the Latin word, "misericordia: miser (wretched, miserable) + cordia (heart)". Literally, it means to take someone else's wretchedness into one's heart. That is what God does with us. Second, the tax collector's prayer recognizes his need for that mercy. He accuses himself of being a sinner, someone who has selfishly abused God's gifts and used his neighbour. The Pharisee's prayer shows no knowledge either of God's mercy or of his need for God; rather, it is an exercise in vanity, in self-admiration. God wants to connect with us, but he can only do so if we let him, and we cannot let him if we do not think we need him.
