Reflection for Today

Last week, in the gospel of St John, we heard Jesus say, "Come and See". This week, in the gospel of St Mark, we hear Him say, "Come and Follow me".

This invitation is not just one-off and not just to the disciples but each one of us in every moment of our lives, especially to the Sunday Eucharist. Jesus continues to invite us to come to him, following him. We have heard this call many times in our lives. However, there are times we rejected it. There are always things we want to do. We always think that we are busy. "I need to take my children to sport, need to do the garden, need to visit the farm..." Indeed, these are good things and good deeds. However, we need to remember that everything in this world comes and goes easily. The question we must ask ourselves "What is the priority in our lives?"

In 2019, Pope Francis instituted "The Sunday of the Word of God" to be held every year on the third Sunday of Ordinary Time. This reminds us of the importance of the "Word of God" in our lives. This is guidance for us on how to live our lives, pleasing God, leading us to His kingdom. So, maybe during this week, we can ask ourselves: How is our attitude toward God's Word? How often do we read the scripture? What have we learned from it?

# INTRODUCTION TO SAFEGUARDING

The effort to ensure safety from sexual or other forms of abuse is an imperative that affects all parishioners. We can all play a part to make the Catholic Church an institution that sets an example in dealing with abuses in the past as well as avoiding them in the future. Fortunately, we have guidance from the NZ Catholic Bishops' Conference and our own Diocese in how to do this. Mr Matthew Balm, representing the Diocese, is coming to Hawkes Bay to help clergy, parish staff, lay volunteers and parishioners generally, in Hastings, Napier and Waipawa/Waipukurau to understand how we can reinforce our culture of safeguarding in the Bay. Unfortunately, the demands on his time mean that the notice for the workshops is less than we would prefer however I warmly encourage **ALL** parishioners, **especially those who engage in the ministries of visitation, Children's Liturgy of the Word, and Holy Communion the the sick**, to attend one of the following presentations on **Tuesday 26 January** after the Masses for that day:

**9.30am Our Lady of Lourdes** (Havelock Nth) in the church hall **6pm St Peter Chanel** (Hastings West) in the church hall

There will also be a **Compliance for Managers compulsory workshop** at 1.30pm, on the same day, where clergy and parish staff will be updated on the latest directives from the NZ Bishops Conference. This will be held at the CPH Mission Centre (formerly the presbytery at Sacred Heart).

Mr Balm will also tour our parish structure to look for better ways in which to guarantee the safety of all who come to the parish. I strongly recommend everyone who engages in ministry for our people to actively engage in this important ongoing process.


