Reflection for Today

The readings of today focus on the "Prayer". The first reading tells us how Abraham pleaded with God on behalf of the people of Sodom and Gomorrah! Abraham's prayer highlights a certain familiarity between Abraham and God. Abraham talked to God as if he was just talking to another human person. Abraham was that intimate to God in prayer. He bargained with God. God patiently listened to the persistent/ demanding prayers of Abraham.

The **second reading**. St. Paul talks about baptism. In Jesus, we were baptized, and this made us God's beloved children and inheritors of His kingdom. Our prayer should be like that of a trustful child as shown by the example of Abraham and as taught by Jesus in today's Gospel.

From our **Gospel reading** today that prayer Jesus gave us, as the pattern of all prayers. It is an invitation towards an **attitude** in prayer that goes beyond formulas and specific locations. The lesson is not only about the formula of prayer. It also reminds us that God is our loving and good Father, infinitely better than any human father. So, we should pray with tenderness, intimacy, and full trust in our loving Father since He looks at us as His beloved children. If we must succeed in life, we must adopt Abraham's determination, and the courage and humility of Jesus' disciple. Therefore, we must not be guick to give up. Our God never keeps silent, rather He waits for the appropriate time to respond and act. If with gentleness and calmness of spirit we stand before God in prayer, God will hear us and of course we will succeed. We must not give up the habit of prayer because it is a gift of Jesus through which He empowers us to be constantly in touch with God.
