SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT 25th February 2024

Reflection for Today

"God put Abraham to the test."

What does it mean to be "put to the test"? The Oxford dictionary defines a test as "a critical examination or trial of a person's qualities." Abraham's qualities are put to the test when God asks him to sacrifice his son Isaac. It is a moment of supreme challenge for him. This is his only son, the son of his old age and his only chance of offspring. He does not meet this test with an easy heart but with raw, terrified obedience. His reward is equally great. Isaac is spared and Abraham is promised descendants "as many as the grains of sand on the seashore." [Gen 22:17]

The three disciples in the gospel are also "put to the test". First, it is a test of wonder. Peter, James and John see the face of Jesus shining like the sun, his clothes dazzling white. They also see Moses and Elijah and hear God's voice. Awestruck, Peter talks wildly about building tents! It is an experience beyond all their imagining. As with Abraham their faith is stretched to new limits. The second test for these beautiful and fleeting moments will come later, at the crucifixion. Is the broken, dying figure up on the cross the same as the one they saw up on the mountain?

What about our own moments of "critical examination"? As with tests at school there are questions. God asks, "Can you do this test?" We ask, "How can I do this test when it is so hard?" Mary herself asked, "How can this (child) come about?" She was told, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you." It means that grace to do the test comes with the test. The opening words of the psalm today hold the key. "I trusted even when I said I am sorely afflicted". So, pray for the kind of faith that can trust God even when to trust Him is the hardest thing of all.
