



Reflection for Today

The gospel this week is one of the foundation pieces for the sacrament of Eucharist. In this gospel, Jesus performs a miracle of multiplication. A little boy selflessly offers five barley loaves and two fish. He is eager and willing to share the little he has. What people did not expect was that Jesus was pleased with the offer from the little boy. Then, from this small offering, He fed five thousand men excluding children and women. There are times in life, we might come across some people who are in trouble financially, emotionally, and spiritually. Jesus wants us to reach out to them, offer whatever we can to comfort them in their times of need. The gospel today teaches us that God always cares about His people. However, we need to remember that loving and caring always involve sacrifices. The Eucharist, in addition to being a meal, is also a sacrifice. Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world (Jn 1:29). It was his supreme act of love because there is no greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends (Jn 15:13), and Jesus did this for us while we are still sinners (Rom 5:8).

SACRAMENTS FOR TEENAGERS

The young people preparing with the youth group for sacraments have been enjoying learning together about the significance of the sacraments of initiation. Those who are to be baptized will receive that sacrament at Sacred Heart church on Sunday 1 August at the 9am Mass. The following Sunday, 8 August, at the 5.30pm Mass the newly baptized will be confirmed and receive Holy Communion for the first time while other teenagers will also be confirmed. We look forward to a joyful celebration of the sacraments as these young people grow in faith.

Missionary Discipleship in CPH

Pope Francis teaches that all of us are called to be missionary disciples. This involves sharing the joy of the Gospel in encountering Jesus and deciding to follow him by growing in love and knowledge of the Lord together with others as disciples of the Lord. Furthermore, it obliges us to share the joy of the Gospel in our everyday lives with those around us. To do this we need to engage in witness, dialogue, and accompaniment with those who may or may not be Catholic or even Christian. In CPH we are responding to this call:

- the call to become an invitational parish
- a PPC focused on evangelization and parish cultural renewal
- using the Mission Centre as a place of teaching, prayer, and discipleship
- Alpha programmes twice a year
- Alpha online for those with young children
- establishing Connect Groups to deepen and continue the Alpha experience
- Youth Alpha and sacramental programmes run by the Youth Group in coordination with the colleges
- promotion of Focolare, Passionist Family Groups
- promotion of RCIA

It remains for each of us to appropriate our vocation to spread the Gospel. We do not engage in "programmes" rather in a process of transformation and growth as we respond to the Holy Spirit at work in ourselves and the world. This involves encounter with Christ, conversion, discipleship, communion, and mission. In this way we can build energy as we work with renewed vigour in the vineyard of the Lord

CHARIS is having a conference in October. Details are on the poster on parish noticeboards. CHARIS is the Greek word for Grace. It is an organization formed by Pope Francis through the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life. Its purpose is to unite all expressions of Charismatic Renewal into one Spirit-filled discipleship. In his address at the inauguration of CHARIS the Pope gave three directives: "to share baptism in the Holy Spirit with everyone in the Church, to serve the unity of the body of Christ, and to serve the poor and those in greatest need, physical or spiritual. Members of the Charismatic Renewal, as a current of grace of the Holy Spirit, be witnesses of this love!". Charis operates as a national organization. At the diocesan level, the members are called Current of Grace. You may see local activities such as Fr John Rae's visit to Hawkes Bay being promoted by Current of Grace.
