# Reflection for Today

We all have the same struggle in our lives which is the battle between two spirits, one good and the other evil. This happens within our conscience. One is the spirit of generosity and self-sacrifice and the other is the spirit of complacency and self-satisfaction. However, the rich man in the gospel today had not been accused of what he did do, but what he did not do. There are times in our lives, in a material world, we tend to look at what others have and are sometimes jealous, complaining to God about it. Whereas with our spiritual lives, we look down and think "We did not commit any crimes, we did not steal...so we are ok."

However, the gospel today asks us to look beyond our normal attitudes.

We need to remember that there is nowhere in the scripture that Jesus accused the rich in favour of the poor. There were misconceptions held and taught by the Sadducees. They believe that material wealth is the reward for their moral uprightness. Therefore, they can use it according to their desires. Jesus warns them about this behaviour. He reaffirms to them, the consequent retribution they will receive in the next life for their deeds and neglects in this life.

The parable also offers an invitation to each one of us to be conscious of the sufferings of those around us and to share our blessings generously. There are still many "Lazaruses" in our society and community. Many of these modern-day "Lazaruses" are spiritually poor, drug-addicted, lonely, indifferent... So, are we reaching out? Are we doing anything to help them? If our lives have been blessed, then it is our duty and responsibility to share it with those in need. Therefore, let us give thanks for all the grace that we have received from the Lord, and let us not forget to lift the lives of the people less fortunate than ourselves.

The month of October each year is dedicated to the **Most Holy Rosary**. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7. It was instituted to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The practice of dedicating the entire month of October to the Holy Rosary developed toward the end of the last century. Pope Leo XIII (papacy: 1878-1903) strongly promoted the increase of devotion to the Blessed Mother by encouraging the constant use of the Rosary.

The Rosary is primarily a scriptural prayer. This can be summarized by the traditional phrase used by Pope Pius XII (papacy: 1939-1958) that the Rosary is "a compendium of the entire Gospel" (AAS 38 [1946] p. 419). The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centred on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption.

In this month of October, let us consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a means that we too can use in order to draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation.
