The HOLY FAMILY of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

26th December 2021



Yesterday, we celebrated the Birth of our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. Today, the Church invites us to honor the three people who make up the Holy Family. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The birth of the Savior of the world is a true mystery. Consequently, there is no doubt that the Holy Family is not like other families. In the Gospel of Luke, we learn that Jesus at the age of 12, indicated what His mission in life would be. It would be to do our Father's will in all things.

The loss of Jesus for those few days must have caused Mary and Joseph great anxiety. His answer to Mary's question must have perplexed her, and Joseph as well. The Gospel then said, "they did not understand what he said to them" (LK 2: 50). However, we need to remember that Jesus returned to Nazareth with them and lived as a dutiful son. We all know through the scripture that He remained there for 18 years until the Holy Spirit called him into the desert and then to the Jordan River to begin his mission.

This is the time for us to reflect who we are in our family "the domestic church". With parents, God entrusted you the care of your children. To bring them up, showing them the beauty of our faith, educating them about Christ's love for them, and the sacrifice He made on the cross for our salvation. 

CHRISTMAS MESSAGES 2021

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us! The mystery of the Incarnation is at the very heart of Christian faith. The Christian believes that God became man, that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. Christmas celebrates the historical event of Jesus' Birth in Bethlehem. It is a historical event because it is prophesied and professed by the prophets throughout the Scriptures. The historical story of Jesus' Birth begins with the Fall of humanity (cf. Genesis 3:15) and ends with the Fall of Satan (cf. Revelation 12:17). Although the Fourth Gospel does not contain a narrative of Jesus' birth like the Gospels of Matthew and Luke, it does mention his "coming into the world" "his being with God and himself as God "and "becoming flesh" saying, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.... And the Word became flesh and lived among us." (John 1: 1-14) The theology and spirituality of Christmas use a phrase to describe this event, they speak of an admirabile commercium, that is, a wondrous exchange between divinity and humanity. St Athanasius of Alexandria says: "The Son of God became man so that we might become God" (De Incarnatione, 54, 3: PG 25, 192). Christmas means pausing to contemplate that Child, the Mystery of God who became man in humility and poverty, but above all it means welcoming within us once again that Child who is Christ the Lord. Therefore, celebrating Christmas is showing the joy and the light that this Birth brought to the whole of our life so that we too may be heralds of joy, and the light of God to others. Wishing you all a Christmas Season blessed by God's presence!
