# Reflection for Today

We are living in a culture where people are afraid to mention their sins. We sometimes even soften it, within ourselves, thinking that other people commit greater sins compared to us. However, in the gospel today, Jesus reminds us that even small sins matter. It can ruin our lives. What Jesus said in the gospel today seems very hard. We all know that we are not perfect. On the journey of our earthly life, we make mistakes, committing sins against God, our brothers and sisters and lose our dignity. We need to take care, because Jesus said in the Gospel, that hell does exist, and we need to avoid it. Even get rid of some apparent unalienable things: without hands (cf. Mk 9,43), without feet (cf. Mk 9,45), without eyes (cf. Mk 9,47). Because that is the place 'where the worms that eat them never die, and the fire never goes out' (Mk 9:48). We must have the strong desire to enter the Kingdom of God, even if we must go without an essential part of ourselves.
