Reflection for Today

27th August 2023

21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Think about pegs for a moment. How useful they are! They hold things up and they hold things down and, although small, they strengthen and stabilize much bigger things. This makes them the ideal image for the Scriptures today. In the First Reading the Lord says of Eliakim, "I drive him like a peg into a firm place." As the new master of the palace Eliakim is invested with the symbols of authority: a robe, a sash, a key. He will have indisputable power to "open and close".

The links to the gospel are obvious. When Peter declares "You are the Christ", Jesus chooses him as the founding rock for His Church. Like Eliakim, Peter will act as a peg, securing the Church, even against the gates of the underworld. He, too, will have keys of authority and the power to bind and to loose. Jesus is clearly elevating Peter to be the top man, the chef de mission. However, Jesus Himself is the Master Builder and He will build according to His own designs.

Every pope since Peter has been working to that unfolding blueprint. Not easy! They need the flexibility of the Spirit with the firmness of the rock. For Pope Francis the Church is "Mother", full of patience and tenderness. He wants the Church - that's us - to touch lives with the anointing of grace. "My dear people," he says, "go out, go out to wherever there is suffering and darkness. Take what little ointment you have and give it to those who have nothing at all."

What "ointment" will you take away from Mass today? Who will you give it to in the coming week?







