Reflection for Today

"Here is teaching with authority behind it."

Jesus had many titles in His life on earth. One of them was Rabbi or, in Aramaic, Rabbuni, which means Master or Teacher. Part of His mission was to teach. We do not know what He was teaching in the synagogue this day. That's not the point of the gospel passage. Rather it is to highlight the authority behind His teaching. When Jesus taught it left a deep **impression**. Others saw and heard something that marked Him out as greater than their other teachers. Who else could exorcise an unclean spirit with just two sharp commands? No wonder His reputation spread rapidly and everywhere.

Where does this authority come from? It comes from His Father. In John 12:49 Jesus says, "What I have spoken does not come from myself; no, what I had to speak was commanded by the Father who sent me." How, then, should we respond? All the readings today give the same answer. **Listen to Him** — with "undivided attention." To become good listeners requires 'homework'. Archbishop Paul Martin S.M. says that as Catholic people we need to do more spiritual reading because "it helps us to reflect on our lives, to understand what we believe and to allow the Holy Spirit to speak to our hearts." [Welcom August '23]

So, as we move away from summer holiday mode and get into the serious business of the year, let us resolve to give more time to our spiritual enrichment.. Keep it simple, persevere and be sure of this — God wants to be found and He will reward every little effort we make to come closer to Him.

Youth Bay Camp - El Rancho

On Friday 5th January, we took 33 people, including seven adults/leaders, to this wonderful camp for the 4th time since 2021. The theme was 'BELONGING" where we broke down to four different parts: Alone, Inviting, Accepting and Needed. We started our programme at Our Blessed Mother's statue on the hill, Paraparaumu, by praying the Holy Rosary for a successful camp and fine weather. Then we headed to the camp site, arriving just after 3pm, and straight to the Chapel for our first activity which was a Mass celebrated by Fr Marcus Francis. That Mass set out the tone for the rest of our time at that lovely camp site. Fortunately, we were blessed with fine weather for our outdoor activities which we will be forever grateful for a loving God that always granted the desires of our hearts. We had adoration on the first night where most of us experienced some amazing moments with the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. The rays of the Divine Mercy of the Lord appeared during Adoration which reminds us of God's endless Love and Mercy for us poor sinners when we repent and return to him as the prodigal son did. We had been touched by the strong presence of the Holy Spirit in many ways throughout the duration of camp. On the second evening, we welcomed a new member to our Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion. What a joy to watch Fr Trung saying part of the celebration in his mother tongue.

On our last day we celebrated one of our teens' 18th birthday which made her day more special to be surrounded by our faith community.

<u>Life Teen Summer Camp - St Peter College, Cambridge</u>.

We took 20 people, including five young adults and two adults/core team members. We also sent three young adults as Summer Missionaries and we are grateful for how they grew deeper in their faith and offered themselves to serve as part of the Life Teen Aotearoa Summer Staff. Thank you so much Stephanie Allen, June Sheardown and Christian Josh Villanueva for being role models to our young people. The theme of this year's camp was "REAL PRESENCE" where the host, from the States, Maggie, broke down how Jesus is present to us in many ways, and most importantly, in the EUCHARIST, which is the summit of our faith. Everyone had witnessed the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist at camp through Masses as there was a teaching Mass by five priests who were on site for the whole five days. One of the campers' highlights was Adoration where most of them experienced that amazing strong presence of Christ in an unexplainable way. Our group were blessed to lead the first ever Multi-Culture Mass at camp on the last night where everyone was asked to wear their cultural attire. This was one of everyone's highlights too, when we all embraced our cultures. As the camp came to an end on Saturday 20th, all campers were sad as they wished there would be a few more days. There were lots of powerful messages that our young people learnt and we pray that they will hold onto those teachings as they search more of our loving God.

Those two wonderful youth formation events couldn't have eventuated without many people's generous support.

Our sincere thanks to our priests: Fr Paul Finlayson and Fr Trung, for their on going spiritual guidance and prayers. WELCOME FR. MARCUS FRANCIS AND FR. VIJAY DUNG DUNG



Hi everyone, I am Fr Marcus Francis and I am pleased to return to the Catholic Parish of Hastings in 2024 after a year in the Tararua District.. For those of you who do not know me I thought to provide a brief summary of my history in this diocese: born in England in 1970 I grew up in Taradale, Napier from 1974., I attended Reignier Catholic Primary school, Taradale Intermediate, and St. John's College in Hastings which was from 1983-87. I went to the seminary in Mosgiel in 1995 and was ordained to the priesthood on 24 February 2001. From July 2001 I was Assistant Priest at Cathedral of the Holy Spirit and departed to Rome to study Canon Law between 2006 and 2010. On my return I was Parish Priest at St. Mary's, Palmerston North, and St. Brigid's in Feilding, This was followed by a stint in Whanganui for three year from 2017 to 2020. My ministry

at Hastings parish with Fr Trung Nguyen and Fr Anthony Htun, was interrupted, amongst other things, by covid as well as my father's and Fr Anthony's death. As a result, I am happy to respond to Bishop John Adam's desire that I have another opportunity to serve this diverse and vibrant parish filled with so many faithful and generous missionary disciples. I am grateful to Fr Trung, Fr Paul Finlayson and the rest of the parish team for all they have done to maintain and build on the pastoral life of this parish in the past year.



Kia Ora Whanu (Greetings) I am Fr. Vijay Dung dung , coming from Northern part of India. I was born and brought up in a small rural village called Duarcini, 24kms away from the city, and for my primary schooling I had to walk 5kms every day. After primary school I left my village and went to the city to complete high school and intermediate graduation and then in 1998 I joined the Seminary and was ordained a priest on 27th of Dec. 2006, together with 26 companion priests, that was held in the middle south of India . In Oct. 2009 I came into the Diocese of Palmerston North and my first appointment was at St. Joseph's Parish New Plymouth (Taranaki) as an Assistant Parish Priest for 4½ years and after that was appointed PP of Opunake (Our Lady Star of the Sea) for 5 years and then took a Sabbatical in July 2019 , returning back home and stayed with my parents. I then came back to the Diocese in 2020, just before the pandemic, and Cardinal John Dew appointed me as an Assistant Priest of the "Kotahi Ano " Parishes in Manawatu. Now, after 4 years in Manawatu, Bishop John Adams has appointed me as an Assistant PP of Hastings in which I am looking forward to working with you all. God bless you all. Fr. Vijay
