Reflection for Today



Today, we celebrate the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, the climactic/final point of Jesus earthly ministry. Today's liturgy, carries some mixed feelings. At the beginning, the whole setting was excited with the picture of palms and beautiful decorations, combined with the chants/shout of "Hosanna to the son of David". As we moved in procession into the church, the palm leaves waved gloriously in the air, presenting the majestic joy/happiness, with which Jesus entered Jerusalem. However, as soon as we entered the church with proclamation of the passion of our Lord, the atmosphere turns downhearted and nervous /uneasy as we hear the associate events that led to the crucifixion of Jesus.

Jesus' determination to enter Jerusalem and face death without resistance, was foretold in the first reading, "I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting". We all have our goals set by God for us to accomplish on earth, which are strongly connected with our final goal, the heavenly Jerusalem. However, there are so many distractions, trials and troubles, painful roads, true enemies and false friends that we have to battle with, before we could reach our goals. So, do not be afraid of falling, and do not be afraid of rising, for our Lord's hands are ready to lift us up again, if we are ready to continue the journey. Therefore, for us to succeed, we must be humble and do nothing out of selfish interest.

May God help us, to overcome the distractions on our way, so that one day, we shall meet him in the heavenly Jerusalem. HAPPY PALM SUNDAY TO YOU ALL!
