Reflection for Today

Today is the 4th Sunday of Easter season is sometimes called Good Shepherd Sunday because in each of the three lectionary cycles, the Gospel reading invites us to reflect on Jesus as the Good Shepherd. And the readings, reminds us that Jesus Christ leads us through the gate of salvation. In the first reading, Peter calls us to conversion. And the psalm reminds us that God is always caring for us as a shepherd care for his sheep.

Jesus in the gospel today calls us together as the Good Shepherd. Jesus overcomes the barriers we place between us, by becoming the sheepgate, the way to gather together through him and with him. Jesus is telling his listeners that, those who follow him, and his way will find abundant life. Jesus identifies himself, both as the shepherd and the gate. The idea of a shepherd comes to a new understanding when God stands before His people and when Jesus says these sacred words: "I am the shepherd." Not a shepherd, not will become a shepherd. But "I am the shepherd. My sheep know me, and I know my sheep, and I give my sheep life, life itself."

Jesus is that shepherd for us, the shepherd who gives his life and knows his sheep. We need also to recognize his voice and follow. Jesus leads us out as his flock to create the world. But he is more than just a shepherd, because Jesus is actually the gate. He is the way to enter a new space, the space where we do what Jesus calls us to do. He knows each of us. He cares for us personally. As Jesus knows and cares for us, so should we know and care for each other. That is the space Jesus wants us in.

There are so many voices in our lives. Which is Jesus'? When we listen to Jesus we enter through Jesus, the sheepgate, to a new world. We are transformed. To enter through Jesus, is to know Jesus enough, that we can follow his lead in our lives. If we are transformed, we can also help transform others, and make the world a better place.

VOCATION NOTICE FROM FR TRUNG

For most Vietnamese babies, when they get baptized, the parents choose a patron saint for them. It is not recorded in the civil documents, but it will be in the baptism record.

I was born and raised in a catholic family. I am one of seven children. Many of you would know that there are six boys and one girl in my family. Lien, my sister, has survived and now is a happy mum!

Our parents have chosen St Joseph as the patron saint for three of the boys and St Peter for the other three, and Lien is Mary. My parents told me that they prayed hard that there might be one of us who would become a priest in the future, especially from those who they chose St Peter as their patron saint.

Well, God must have been listening! Two "Josephs" and two "Peters" are following the vocation to the priesthood. I got ordained as a priest on the 6th of June 2020. On the 27th of May 2023, my younger brother, who belongs to The Missionaries of St. Charles - Scalabrinians, will be ordained as a priest in Atlanta, US. On the 10th of June 2023, my older brother will be ordained as a transitional deacon for the Arch Diocese of Washington DC, and my youngest brother has made his First Profession and is studying in Rome with the Institute of Charity (The Rosminians).

When I talk to my brothers, they always tell me that we cannot follow this journey without the grace of God, and without the prayers of so many people, and especially their help and support. We are always grateful for that.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday. I ask you humbly to pray for me and for Fr Paul (he's a Columban – a life-long missionary) and all the priests that we may serve God and you, His people, ever more faithfully.

To young people, **DO NOT BE AFRAID** to follow the vocation to the priesthood or Religious Life. As human beings, we are all limited, fragile, and we do not feel worthy of this vocation. But are you willing? By the grace of God, you can become his instrument to spread the good news, bringing God's love to His people through the sacraments, through the consecrated life and through joyful ministry along the hikoi of life.

Understanding and Healing the Impact of Disasters

Disasters throw our world into chaos. They can overwhelm us and cause significant psychological distress. The good news is that many communities have gone through disasters and found a positive way through. This talk will cover, what are the long-term impacts of a disaster and how you can look out for and support those who are struggling and learn some strategies to strengthen your resilience.

What can you expect in the weeks, months, and years after a disaster? When is the biggest psychological impact of a disaster?

What can you do to help children and families who are really not coping post disaster?

Why is good sleep so important to recovery?
What are the signs someone may not be coping?
What are some powerful strategies to help build resilience?

Michael Hempseed is the director of Frontiers of Hope, a specialist mental health service. He is also the author of Calming your Child and Being A True Hero: Understanding and Preventing Suicide in Your Community. He has spoken to Fonterra, NZ Post, Fire and Emergency NZ and many others. Michael gained an honours degree in Psychology from the University of Canterbury in 2008. In 2016 he spoke at TEDx. Michael is Catholic.


