Reflection for Today

The readings for 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time are a warning against becoming too attached to worldly goods and temporary pleasures of this life/world. We are also reminded that we are in a temporary world. Therefore, it is a call to make use of the things of this world carefully without losing our ultimate/final goal. It is only when we make Heaven our final **goal** that the full meaning of life would be revealed and realized.

Our first reading, begins with a warning: "Vanity, vanity, the preacher says vanity...!" It strikes a reality that most of us have neglected. The Preacher calls us to remember God in all we do. The Preacher reminds us that there will be an ultimate end to all created things. He also reminds us that the **goal** here on earth is to walk our way straight to Heaven. We are warned that the things of this world will not bring us ever lasting joy.

The second reading hits the nail on its head. Paul clearly differentiates true life, that is life lived in Christ, from life lived outside Christ. Paul reminds us that we must be Heaven committed where Christ is everything. We Christians are invited to live according to the teachings of Jesus, and they are truly opposing to cultural today!

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives a lesson on greed [selfishness]. Possessions are not what defines/determines life. We need to share the goods of the earth. God gave us gifts not for ourselves but for the service of the community. We can only consume and use so much. We tend to over secure our future that we deprive/strip our present. We tend to forget that tomorrow may never come. Possessions can only satisfy us to a point. The material goods cannot be the purpose of life for a Christian. In the end, only One can only satisfy us, and He is God! How much is enough for us? God should be our enough!
