FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

3rd December 2023

Reflection for Today

As we enter the first week of Advent, we are reminded that our own plans may not align with God's vision for the world. During the season of Advent, we are called to reflect on our lives and renew our commitment to God's plan.

The readings call us to return to God's path and understand that He wants to restore all of creation to Himself, not just fulfil our individual desires.

In our **first reading**, Isaiah speaks of a people who have strayed from God's ways. This message is relatable to us all as we navigate our daily challenges and can become lost in our immediate wants and grievances. The call of Advent is a call to trust in God's plan, even when it seems distant or difficult to comprehend.

The second reading speaks of grace, fellowship, and strengthening of faith as we await the revelation of Jesus Christ. It's a time to reflect on the grace that is given to us through Christ. As we prepare our hearts for Christmas, we are invited to reflect on how this grace has been evident in our lives and how we might extend it to others. We are called to trust in God's provision, recognising that spiritual growth is part of the preparation for Jesus' comina.

From the **Gospel**, Jesus advises his disciples to stay vigilant, to stay awake, as no one knows when He will return. This is not just a call for the disciples of Jesus' time but for us today. Life is full of unpredictable events, both tragic and joyful. Therefore, we must live in a state of readiness, serving Christ through our actions, words, and thoughts at every moment.

Advent is a time to prepare, watch, and be attentive to how we can serve and encounter God daily. Just as the servants in the parable are tasked with specific roles, each person has unique responsibilities in their life. The call to be aware reminds us to perform our duties diligently, with the conscious intention that our actions should align with the teachings of Christ. Our whole life should be a life spent for Jesus and His kingdom. This, then, will enable us to welcome the coming of Jesus with joyful expectation, hope, and eagerness. Such is the spirit and overall theme of Advent: "Come, Lord Jesus, come!"
