# Reflection for Today

"The way you think is not God's way". The gospel today is about our difficulty to understand and to accept suffering. When Peter hears that his beloved Master is going to Jerusalem to suffer and die he protests, "Lord, this must not happen to you." Jesus sees His impending death in a different way. He says that He is "destined" to go, that it is for "this hour" that He came. Of course He shrinks from the suffering; of course He asks to be spared. Matthew's gospel records that, in Gethsemane, Jesus "threw Himself on the ground" in supplication. Nevertheless, He will not back down.

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

3rd September 2023

Herein lies the great Christian paradox - to save our life we must lose it, the way of Jesus is the way of the cross. The particular cross which we are sent is what we find so hard. Louis Evely writes: "In theory we are all prepared to accept a cross but when it comes it is never the right one... never made to our size. Instead of a cross that is bearable and uplifting we get one that crushes us." When Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger was elected pope - becoming Benedict XV1 - he felt as if "a guillotine" had come down on him! The ultimate struggle for all of us is with the will of God, with the way God thinks.

How to cope? Here are some thoughts from my spiritual reading. Don't pretend it doesn't hurt. Suffering is suffering. You, too, may want to throw yourself on the ground in distress. Don't think you cannot pray. A cry from the depths of your soul for the mercy of God is prayer indeed. The psalms are full of such cries. Don't lose hope. God is working out something in your life, and all things come to an end, even the worst of things. Finally, don't waste your pain. You can transfer it, like money to someone else's account. Ask the Lord to use it to help others in their pain, to save souls - and to save your own.


#### **FIRST AID OFFICERS**
