

He went off to a lonely place

What interests me in today's gospel are the two time markers. It is "after sunset" when they bring the sick to Jesus for healing. It is "long before dawn" when Jesus leaves the house to pray. That makes it very short night for Him. Yet, when His companions find Him the next morning the first words out of their mouths are, "Everybody is looking for you." Immediately He goes back to work.

Parents and caregivers will identify with this. There is little time to rest when everybody is looking for you. So, how do we serve others without wearing ourselves thin? Look at our Lord. He purposefully sought silence and solitude. In spite of His busyness He made it a priority to come back to His Father and to recharge His soul with prayer.

Do we? Do we purposefully seek times of silence and solitude so we can pray? Busyness can so easily turn into a treadmill. Listen to what Job says about "drudgery" in the First Reading! If our Lord could not constantly go-go-go and give-give-give then neither can we. There has to be a place for us to guieten our thoughts and come back to God.

Where, you ask, do we find such a place? Since God is everywhere that place can be everywhere. First, however, we must value prayer itself and truly believe in its benefits. Opening up to God in our hearts will open up places of prayer. God will hallow those places, no matter how ordinary, and reward us with rest for our souls. Then, recharged, we are better equipped to become, like St. Paul, "the slave of everyone."

FIVE WAYS to welcome a new priest to a parish. Here are some great tips:

Be patient. Everything is new! New faces, new buildings, new schedules, new ministries, new faces, new names, new routines, did I mention new faces?? In our parish, there are so many parishioners, activities and things going on. We need to give lots of grace and patience.
 Introduce yourself, your name, what you're involved in and don't be embarrassed to do it more than once! Don't be offended if he doesn't remember you from that first meeting. You are meeting one new person; he is meeting HUNDREDS!

3. Let him change his mind. Sometimes questions are thrown at a new priest and, like all of us, they can be caught off guard. Sometimes decisions are rushed or without knowing all the details. Once again, give a lot of grace and wiggle room. Put yourself in their shoes.

4. Did your mother ever tell you that "Comparison is the thief of joy"? Comparing to what we're used to is an easy trap to fall in. We all know that no two people are alike, we shouldn't expect our priests to be alike either. Again, this is where grace and patience come into play, and we should avoid the comparison trap which poisons relationships.
5. Pray, pray, pray. We should always pray for all our priests. They are

under enormous pressure. "When people want to destroy religion, they begin by attacking the priest; for when there is no priest, there is no sacrifice: and when there is no sacrifice, there is no religion. -St. John Vianney
