Reflection for Today

All of us have been asked to look at the grace we receive at our Baptism. We are purified by the water and sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the Gospel of Saint Matthew, Jesus tells us to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Salt was connected to purity because it was white and came from the purest of all things, the sun, and the sea. Jewish people used salt as part of offering sacrifice. This is a calling to ask us to be pure in all the things we do, as we are the children of God. Purity in the way we think, the way we talk, the way we look, and the way we act. How we behave towards each other is an indication of who and what we are inside.

As salt preserves food, we need to preserve the Catholic Faith, Christian cultural values, and moral principles, which Jesus has given to us through the scripture and the Church. We also have been asked to bring the reconciliation to our families and communities. We are now living in a society with often bad news and negativity. We have been sent to bring good news and a positive attitude to people around us.

At our baptism, we have received "the light of Christ". This light includes love, kindness, mercy, forgiveness, humility, and respect for each other. We need to make that light shine in our lives. This is not an easy task to do as it requires our sacrifice in different ways. However, we know the promise Jesus made to us. He said to St Paul: "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Cor 12:9). The question to us is:

"Do we open our hearts to receive the grace that Jesus wants to give us through the sacraments, especially in Eucharist and Reconciliation?"


