Reflection for Today



Pentecost – the birth of the Church and the building of Communities

Once there was one Parish of Hastings. It was based in Heretaunga Street and called Sacred Heart. Many older people remember baptisms, marriages and funerals which were held in the older wooden Church building. In the early 1960s the one Parish became three – Our Lady of Lourdes, Saint Peter Chanel, and Sacred Heart. Always there was the Maori Pastoral Care Church in Paki Paki. Now the Parish of Hastings is one again with its different Communities of faith.

Over generations it has been the Holy Spirit that gave guidance, inspiration, and gifts to build up the Community of faith. In each aged people are gifted to help the Community to grow. When we listen to the inspired Word of God, search the teachings of the Church, and partake of the Body and Blood of Christ we are gathered into one by the Holy Spirit. What role does the Holy Spirit play in your life? What gifts has the Holy Spirit given to you?

In the beginning the earth was a formless void, there was darkness over the deep and God's Holy Spirit hovered over the water. There was life and light. This same Holy Spirit hovered over Mary, the young maiden of Nazareth. With her consent she conceived Jesus the Son of God. After the Ascension of Jesus Mary waited in Jerusalem with the Apostles for the promised Holy Spirit. She led them in prayer and reminded them of all that her Son, their friend, had said and done. This Holy Spirit came and settled upon them. They went out and preached Jesus is Lord with courage and conviction.

From their witness in Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria the Good News rippled outwards to the ends of the earth. We are still building up our communities of faith guided by the Holy Spirit.

Towards an ever-wider "we": A Church that reaches out.

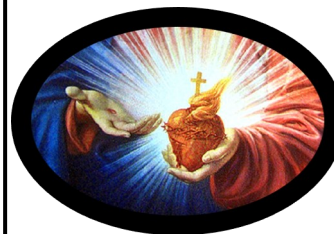
