Reflection for Today

Today's Gospel describes how Jesus healed a deaf man with a speech impediment. We are living in a busy society. There are many things and many voices in our lives that take us away from Christ. We hardly hear what the Lord wants to say to us because we are busy listening to other voices. During these times, it is a great opportunity for us to find time to be alone with Jesus, listening to what He wants to tell us. In the gospel today, Jesus was alone with the deaf man. Afterwards, the deaf man did not just open his tongue to speak, he also opened his heart to welcome Jesus into his life. There are moments in our lives; we are blind, we are deaf. We are blind to the need of people around us. We are deaf to the voiceless in society. We are even deaf to God's voice. Therefore, unable to speak the words of gratitude for all the blessings we have received.
