First Sunday of Lent 6th March 2022

Reflection for Today

On this very first Sunday of Lent, the Word of God reminds us that God is first, and He must be first in our lives! In the story of the gospel reading, Jesus was tempted three times, but He remained faithful to His Father; He placed the Will of His Father above everything else. The first temptation was, for Jesus to turn stones into bread after His fast. This meant that Jesus was tempted to use His power/position for selfish gains, or to "bribe" people to become His followers. The good news is that Jesus resisted and overcame this temptation by making the WORD of His Father first: "Man shall not live by bread alone but by every word of God".

In the second temptation, the devil showed Jesus all the earthly kingdoms and promised to give them to Jesus if He worshipped him. Thus, Jesus was tempted to worship a "god" other than His Father or to compromise on His faith and mission, but He did not give in. On the Third Temptation, Jesus was tempted to be sensational or to put God to the test by jumping down from the pinnacle of the Temple. Again, Jesus overcame this temptation by putting God first – and not putting God to the test. Students do not examine their teachers, and so we should avoid putting God to the test. We should, for instance, avoid always looking for signs and wonders before believing in God. Let us always put God first: * When we succeed in life, let us remember our humble beginnings and remain faithful to

- God who blesses us. * When we are tempted to misuse or abuse our power or position, let us remember where
- the power or position has come from and remain selfless and humble, making God first. * When we are tempted to compromise on our faith/principles or worship other gods, let us
- remember the first commandment, and maintain God first. * When tempted to be sensational, let us seek to decrease so God will increase as the First

<u>Te Ara a Maria - Te Hikoi Wairua ki</u> <u>Heretaunga Ararau</u>

On the feast of the Assumption 15 August 2021 the NZ Bishops renewed our county's dedication to Mary, Mother of God. Bishop Pompallier had first dedicated Aotearoa NZ to Mary when celebrating the first Mass here in 1838 in the Hokianga.

To mark the renewal of the dedication our Bishops celebrated a special Mass at St Mary of the Angels, Wellington. At this Mass an artwork,



which had been especially commissioned to honour Mary, was unveiled. This artwork which depicts Mary in an Aotearoa setting, challenges us to see her as a woman of incredible strength and the place she holds in our heart and our community today.

This artwork is now touring NZ. Te Hīkoi Wairua mo te Ara a Maria will be visiting Hastings on 10-12 March. See attached programme for Mary's Way through the Catholic Parish of Hastings. This is an opportunity to view this beautiful taonga and to call on Mary's protection during these troubling times. At the conclusion of the hikoi the artwork will be installed in a shrine at St Mary of the Angels, Wellington.

CATECHISM

The Temptations of Jesus

The Gospels speak of a time of solitude for Jesus in the desert immediately after his baptism by John. Driven by the Spirit into the desert, Jesus remains there for forty days without eating; he lives among wild beasts, and angels minister to him. At the end of this time Satan tempts him three times, seeking to compromise his filial attitude toward God. Jesus rebuffs these attacks, which recapitulate the temptations of Adam in Paradise and of Israel in the desert, and the devil leaves him "until an opportune time" (Luke 4:13). (Catechism Of The Catholic Church, No. 538)

The evangelists indicate the salvific meaning of this mysterious event: Jesus is the new Adam who remained faithful just where the first Adam had given in to temptation. Jesus fulfills Israel's vocation perfectly: in contrast to those who had once provoked God during forty years in the desert, Christ reveals himself as God's Servant, totally obedient to the divine will. In this, Jesus is the devil's conqueror: he "binds the strong man" to take back his plunder. Jesus' victory over the tempter in the desert anticipates victory at the Passion, the supreme act of obedience of his filial love for the Father. (Catechism Of The Catholic Church, No. 539)

Jesus' temptation reveals the way in which the Son of God is Messiah, contrary to the way Satan proposes to him and the way men wish to attribute to him. Therefore Christ vanquished the Tempter for us: "For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning." (Hebrews 4:15) By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert. (Catechism Of The Catholic Church, No. 540)
