7th May 2023 **Reflection for Today**

The gospel this Sunday was just after Jesus washed his disciples' feet. He also told them that they must learn to do the same for others. Jesus knows that He is about to die. He is about to leave them, but He also knows that His death will result in victory. We can feel a heavy air of gloom and anxiety in the heart of all the disciples. Jesus knows it, so He encourages them not to be troubled in their hearts. He informs them of the necessity to trust in God and in him. It is a call to total faith in the Father and in Jesus. Some of us might experience this when we face the death of our loved ones. There would be a lot of things going on in our hearts and minds at those moments. We sometimes even got anxious about what just happened.

The word Jesus said to His disciple in the gospel today; He might say to us the same: "Do not be afraid. My Father's house has many dwelling places.... And if I go and prepare a place for you, then I will come back to you again and take you to myself so that where I am, you also may be." We are the people of resurrection, the people of hope. These words from Jesus give us a lot of comfort when we face the death of our loved ones. These make our lives have meaning, knowing that death is not the end, Jesus is waiting for us to join Him in the kingdom of heaven. However, we also need to remember what Jesus said: "Where I am, you also maybe". Indeed, Jesus had paid the price for our sins by His death on the cross. However, He also tells us that to be there with Him in heaven, we need to fulfil our responsibilities in this earthly life as well. We must trust in His love and mercy, coming to Him to receive grace and forgiveness, knowing that the ultimate goal of our lives is the salvation of our souls.
