
Reflection for Today

The Eucharist Nourishes Eternal Life

Christ packs three significant lessons into this discourse on the Eucharist in today's Gospel passage. Firstly, he points out *the mystery of faith*, that no one can believe in him "unless he is drawn by the Father." When we look at the small white Host, no scientific test can prove that Jesus Christ is truly present there, body, blood, soul, and divinity. We know that he is present *truly, really, and substantially* (CCC.1374) because we have been given the gift of faith by the Father. St. Thomas Aquinas beautifully said, "Faith for all defects supplying, where the feeble senses fail." (CCC 1381)

Secondly, this faith in Christ leads to "eternal life." Later in the Gospel, Jesus tells us that eternal life consists in knowing "the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom God has sent." (John 17:3) In Biblical language, "knowing" implies deep interpersonal intimacy, the kind of relationship we all yearn for. That we can have a relationship like that with God himself, and it is the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Thirdly, Jesus himself is the "bread" of this eternal life, its source and sustenance. Without bread, without food, physical life perishes. Without Jesus, without his "flesh for the life of the world" in the Eucharist, our life of intimate communion with God will perish. Eleven times in this discourse Jesus speaks of himself as the bread of life and he is really hoping that we all get the message. The gift of faith gives us access to eternal life, and the Eucharist makes that life grow within us. Therefore, let us activate our faith so that whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, we remember that the Father has drawn us, and let us give the Lord a solid opportunity to strengthen us for the everlasting life.
