Reflection for Today

The Feast of Easter, the Feast of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, is the central Feast of the Church. It is God's definitive answer to death. Through the Resurrection, God has conquered both sin and death. Our readings today, remind us, it is not just a historical fact that Jesus rose from the dead, but it is a lifetransforming event, not only for Jesus, but also for all who believe in Jesus.

The Easter readings, focus on the goodness, power, and saving work of God throughout history, ending up in the ultimate victory of Jesus over sin and death through His Resurrection. They also emphasize the importance of faith and trust in God, dying to sin and being raised to new life through baptism, and seeking heavenly things rather than earthly ones.

The death of Jesus on the Cross was devastating, but seeing the tomb now empty, they felt deeply what seemed like the emptiness of human existence. Should we adopt Mary Magdalene's interpretation that they have stollen the Lord's body? Peter himself is more confused than ever. Peter remains speechless. Sometimes, we face similar realities, that leave us speechless and depressed. The world is currently facing such state of emptiness and apparent meaninglessness in the face of the present afflictions, terror, or misfortune.

In spiritual matters, we need always to look upwards and deeply to see the saving presence of God. The resurrection of Jesus tells us and in a very loud way that God is always in charge. Even when the forces of destruction seem to be in triumph, God intervenes to show His great power. May the hope and joy of Easter fill our hearts and our lives, now and always.




