Parish Pastoral Council – Call for nominations

Following numerous retirements, I have made five appointments to the Pastoral Parish Council in recent months. I am now seeking nominations from the parish for additional council members.

1. THE ROLE OF THE PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL (PPC)

The PPC works collaboratively with the Parish Priest to set the direction and the policies that guide the parish in carrying out its core functions. It also has a role in evaluating how well the parish's pastoral plans are being implemented. The PPC is supported by the Finance Committee and the Liturgy Committee. It usually meets once a month on a weekday evening, with a few strategic planning days or half days throughout the year.

2. SELECTION PROCESS

A simple election process does not easily ensure the right mix of people with an appropriate spread of skills and experience. For this reason, a pool of nominees will be sought from which a number will be chosen by a Selections Committee made up of Seletuta Visesio-Pita, Lynn Hill, and me. There is no required number; decisions on committee size and composition will depend on the nominations received and the appropriate mix of appointees.

3. NOMINATION PROCESS

Nominations are welcome from individuals or groups within worship communities. You may nominate yourself or another person. It would be helpful to have a good spread of candidates from different worship communities; however PPC members agree to represent the interests of the entire parish first and foremost. A commitment to the parish and a willingness to work as part of a team is a must.

- Nominations must be received by Friday 27th November 2020
- Emails should include:
 - o a brief bio of the nominee
 - the reason why the nominee would like to join the PPC
 - o an outline of previous management or governance experience, if applicable

Although we may not be able to include all nominees on the council due to size constraints, we do welcome all nominations and will endeavour to find a place on the PPC for nominees in the future or to find ways to harness nominees' talents and gifts in some other way in the parish.

4. COMMISSIONING SERVICE

It is our intention to hold a commissioning service for the entire PPC in early February and this will give you an opportunity to meet PPC members. Following this service, the Parish Pastoral Council will have a retreat to get to know each other and set priorities for the year. At this time a Chair is likely to be selected.

5. CURRENT APPOINTMENTS

The five appointments that have already been made are:

> Seletuta (Tuta) Visesio-Pita
